As their tenth wedding anniversary party commences, their quests scramble to get "the story" straight before the other quests arrive. As the confusions and miscommunications mount, the evening spins off into classic farcical hilarity.

Join the <u>St. Joseph Community</u> <u>Chorus</u> on October 22, as they collaborate with Grammy nominated Kansas City organist Jan Kraybill for **Pipes, Pipes, Pipes!** You won't want to miss hearing the choir perform with the beautiful sounds from the pipes of the Visser-Rowland organ at the First Presbyterian Church.

Then it's time to celebrate the season with **SJCC** in the beautiful Cathedral of St. Joseph as they perform their annual **Christmas**  **at the Cathedral** concert on December 17 and 18.

There is so much to view at the Albrecht-Kemper Museum of Art this fall beginning with Then is Now: Works by Ani Hoover: through November 5, 2023- Ani Hoover is an American artist based in Buffalo, NY. She grew up near the AKMA and remembers seeing Fairfield Porter's portrait and Thomas Hart Benton's "Custer's Last Stand" on exhibit and taking classes in the



museum kitchen. Unsurprisingly, color remains one of the most recognizable aspects of Hoover's work. After more than a decade of working as a painter, Hoover's work now includes sculpture and fiber-based techniques. using alternative materials.

The **AKMA** is also presenting **Current Works – Kansas City Society for Contemporary Photography: through November 5.** This exhibit is a selection of works by members of the Kansas City Society for Contemporary Photography, which is a community of regional photographers and collectors



presenting and promoting the photographic arts.

Realizing the importance of the arts in our community, the Executive Committee moved and approved using Arts Fund reserves to fully fund the FY24 allocations to support the work of Creative Arts Productions, Performing Arts Association, RiverSong, Robidoux Resident Theatre, St. Joseph Community Chorus, Saint Joseph Symphony, St. Joseph Youth Chorale, and the Allied Arts Council.



The Allied Arts Council held its annual meeting and the 32nd Annual Mayor's Awards for the Arts on Thursday, July 27, 2023. It was a full house with guests enjoying dinner, socializing and embracing the chance to recognize those who give so much of their time and talents to the arts.

The Mayor's Awards for the Arts are designed to honor and celebrate people and organizations that contribute to the vibrancy of the arts and/or increase access to arts experiences in St. Joseph, Missouri. Nominations were sought for artists, arts organizations, advocates, educators, and corporate citizens that contribute to the arts. A panel of arts leaders from across the state selected the award recipients.
