Walk in recent years, you've no doubt seen the work of Jacob Burmood. His distinctive style is eye-catching. So, what is his background and inspiration?

"As a child, I spent my free hours walking along a creek that had carved its way through a wooded area. All the forces that governed the path of the stream also governed the rocks,

"Sculpture is the most engaging art form in my opinion. I am constantly learning, and nothing is off limits. Painting uses paint, ceramics uses clay, drawing uses charcoal, but there is nothing outside the scope of the effect of invisible forces sculpture."

What materials does he prefer?

"I love working with clay,

fabric, bronze, resin, aluminum, steel and fiberglass," shared Burmood.

His entry for the 2024-25 Downtown Sculpture Walk is "Equal and Opposite," (shown below) which he created in cold cast aluminum.

As we close out the 2023-2024 year, I want to personally thank Teresa Fankhauser for her 19 years of leading the

Allied Arts Council. Her passion and impact on the arts in St. Joseph will be forever admired. It is with the same passion that I am honored to be your new Executive Director and continue the mission to bring arts and people together.

While I am new to this role, I am not new to St. Joseph and its arts community. My family moved to St. Joseph in 1996 and has been my home ever since, with artistic endeavors being my formative experiences.

Coming from a family who thrive in the arts, I followed in their footsteps. As young children, my siblings and I would put on concerts for our parents. We were always encouraged to use the arts as a way of expression and entertainment. I had the privilege to take piano lessons and perform. In high school I was in band, choir, show choir and brought all my talents together in my first musical The Music Man. It was then that I was fully hooked. Downtown Sculpture Walk 2024-25 Winners Announced!

Spring marked the arrival of new sculptures in Downtown St. Joseph, Missouri, for the 11th annual Allied Arts Council Sculpture Walk 2024-25! This year's selections celebrate beauty and creativity with eye-candy around every corner. The Allied Arts Council, in partnership with the City of St. Joseph and the St. Joseph Downtown Community Improvement District, sponsors this annual public art project.

During the June 12 opening reception for the Sculpture Walk, the 2024-25 winners were announced. First place went to the mixed media sculpture "Lean on Me" by Gedion Nyanhongo of Fostoria, Ohio. His African opal stone sculpture is located near the corner of 8th and Felix Street.

"Lean on Me" represents the concept that two is better than one. Life is better when shared with someone you really love," said Nyanhongo.

Second place went to "River People," a stainless steel and Lexan sculpture by Tim Adams of Webster City, Iowa. His sculpture is located on the corner of 7th and Felix Street.

"This sculpture depicts clean water, which has always been a resource that man, plant, and animals depend upon to survive," said Adams.

Third place was awarded to "Embrace," a hand forged iron sculpture by professional welder and sculptor Clark Martinek of Mitchell, South Dakota. His sculpture is located on the corner of 6th and Francis Street.

"With this sculpture I wanted to convey that an embrace makes everything a bit better when coming from a loved one," said Martinek.
