

Catching Up with CAT Designs Artist Chelsea Teater

If you are out and about in the St. Joseph area, chances are you have seen Chelsea Teater in an event booth, or you have seen her creations in stores. So, how did art become a career for her?

"I grew up around art and artsy ideals. My father, Patrick Clark, was a high school art teacher for 40 years. We always had access to art supplies and ideas at home. My Dad is the type of person who taught us how to fix and mend the things we owned. It was my Dad who, unintentionally, taught me how to make/mend jewelry. His little lessons stayed with me," said Teater.

"After almost 10 years in social services, my health took a dip and I had to rethink my career choice. I began painting to pass the time and suddenly they were selling. Not a lot, but enough that I began to wonder if I had stumbled onto a new career. Daniel Johnson, then the Director of the Robidoux Row Museum, asked me if I would be interested in selling some of my art pieces in the Museum gift shop. I asked if I could make a few jewelry pieces too and it turned out that jewelry was my biggest seller. Local store owners began to carry my creations also and it all sprang from there."

How did that eye-catching logo come about?

"Once I knew I was going to be

in shops I needed a name. I found a picture of a cat that I loved and my initials are CAT (Chelsea A. Teater) and as I design jewelry, CAT Designs Jewelry came into being," explains Teater. "A great piece of jewelry can make any person feel beautiful, so I strive to keep my pieces affordable and accessible to all," she adds.

In addition to jewelry, she still paints.

"When I am lost for good jewelry making ideas I paint. When I have painters' block I create jewelry. And when I was stumped on both fronts I started making miniatures. I've always loved miniature items and that love just kind of grew, so now I teach "I recently won the best jewelry store/jewelry in the 2023 News Press Readers Choice Award. That was a huge surprise and honor," shares Teater.

"I would love to see CAT Designs grow into a brick and mortar store where I can help other small business vendors get started. If we invest in each other and give a little help to those pursuing a dream, beautiful things happen. I am also looking at having my Dad's art for sale, now that he's retired, at events. I want people to see the talent that inspired me when I was little," said Teater.



The Evolution of an Artist by Carol Myers

My adventure with acting took off when my friend Tad Hopkins suggested I try out for a play at the Missouri Theater Peter Pan. called Our Town with

Robidoux Resident Theatre directed by Mike Pittman. After being cast as Emily, I quickly learned from Tad, Mike and other cast members about staying true to the text, teamwork, getting off book quickly and performing for the audience not yourself; sort of life lessons, but theatre style. I learned that I loved this thing called acting!

Previously I'd performed here and there. I was in a 5th grade drama about Betsy Ross, a little something in our middle school talent show. show choir, all-school musicals and I was the emcee for the Senior Revue. Finally, the lead in my high school musical, The Sound of Music. Performing for the public on the big stage of the Missouri Theater was the next step.

I went on to do several dramas with RRT until someone suggested I try out for a musical, "since I could sing". There is something about using your whole body, singing, dancing, and acting that is very ground-

ing, a kinesthetic quality that can be very freeing. My all time favorite role was playing Peter Pan because of the physicality it required. Having gone through a running phase, I likened this feeling to a runner's high. I hope that everyone, with their given talent whether it be gardening, or bowling, or whatever, has the chance to experience that euphoria in a job well done.

Time passed and I married Bemo Myers, my high school sweetheart and a performer in his own right. He introduced me to the New Generation

Singers, which continues to be a source of performing. We were blessed with Mia and Joey, our children. Between myself, Bemo, and the Myers family, the kids ended up with the performing gene. Before long we were experiencing the joys of performing together. Mia performs locally with RRT, acting and playing in the pit, while Joey received a musical theater degree and is currently touring with the National Tour of the Book of Mormon.

On directing: I have a vivid memory of sitting in the Missouri Theater with another actor waiting for rehearsal to begin and we were talking about how we had no desire whatsoever to be a director. But several years later, Mike Swymeler and Jeff Haney encouraged me to give it a try. Missouri Theater Manager Frank Polleck supported me with the technical aspects and I found that I liked directing! People often ask me which I prefer more,

acting or directing. Acting allows you to dig more deeply into one

while directing allows you to leave a fingerprint on every aspect of the show. Both extremely fulfilling to me.

Through the years I've acted in maybe 50 shows and directed some 20 or so. I've won a few awards over the years. They look nice on the shelf and are always appreciated, but the true fulfillment comes with those moments on and off the stage, creating art with your cast and crew, and then giving your audience an hour or two to escape into an alternate reality. It's a win/ win experience for everyone.

After teaching for 34 years, I retired and am currently working part time at RRT with Executive Director Sandy Burg and Program Director Lindsay Prawitz, directing and assisting with the youth programs. It's the best of both worlds, teaching our future actors about theater!

I encourage anyone who has ever had even a passing thought of auditioning for a show to go for it. Theatre is more than just acting, singing and dancing. The collaborate effort of creating something much larger than yourself and throwing it out there for the world to see is a natural high you won't soon forget.


